Teaching Experience

Instructor of Record Current Courses:

Principles of Microeconomics (two sections), Department of Economics, Barney Barnett School of Business and Free Enterprise, Florida Southern College

This course introduces students to the fundamentals of microeconomics and provides students with a better understanding of the relationship between the economic way of thinking and business decisions and strategy.

Principles of Macroeconomics (two sections), Department of Economics, Barney Barnett School of Business and Free Enterprise, Florida Southern College

This course introduces students to the fundamentals of macroeconomics and the use and analysis of statistical aggregates (e.g., GDP, unemployment, inflation). The class will give a historical overview of macroeconomic modeling and will lead to a better understanding of current macroeconomic conditions, tools, and theories.

Money and Banking, Department of Economics, Barney Barnett School of Business and Free Enterprise, Florida Southern College

This course provides a critical understanding of the theory, history, and policy of monetary and banking institutions and their impact upon real economic variables. Topics include the origin of money, the Federal Reserve System, monetary policy and implementation, interest rates, inflation, and financial structure and regulation.

Comparative Economic Institutions, Department of Economics, Barney Barnett School of Business and Free Enterprise, Florida Southern College

This course focuses primarily on comparative political economics and offers a study of the theoretical and practical differences between highly centralized “command” economies and comparatively decentralized “market” economies. Most importantly, students will understand how the underlying institutions within these economies shape human behavior and interaction through an analysis of different policies and economic systems across the world.

Public Choice, Department of Economics, Barney Barnett School of Business and Free Enterprise, Florida Southern College

This course introduces students to the field of public choice economics, that is, the application of the tools of economics to political decision-making. Some of the topics discussed include but are not limited to public goods, externalities, voting, regulation, bureaucracy, game theory, and welfare.

Austrian Economics, Department of Economics, Barney Barnett School of Business and Free Enterprise, Florida Southern College

Beginning with Carl Menger’s foundational contributions and extending through the work of contemporary representatives, the class examines how the ideas of Austrian economics have evolved to address questions of markets, coordination, and innovation. The writings of Ludwig von Mises, F.A. Hayek, and others will serve as important guides.

Instructor of Record Past Courses:

Business and Economic Statistics (two sections), Spring 2024, Department of Economics, Business, and Accounting, Hillsdale College

This course introduces basic statistical concepts and methods commonly used to make data-based decisions in business applications. Topics include descriptive statistics, sampling distributions, statistical inference, and hypotheses testing.

Econometrics, Spring 2024, Department of Economics, Business, and Accounting, Hillsdale College

This course introduces the theory and practical application of econometric techniques. Topics include simple linear regressions, multiple linear regressions, basic time series models, and other advanced topics.

Applied Business Economics, Fall 2022, Rawls College of Business, Texas Tech University

The course provides students with a better understanding of the relationship between the economic way of thinking and business decisions and strategy through the application of the principles of microeconomics.

Capitalism, Free Trade, and Globalization, Fall 2022, Faculty of Economic Sciences, Francisco Marroquín University

In the format of a text-based, Socratic Dialogue, this course explores the related subjects of free trade and globalization, with particular emphasis on the interrelated institutions of capitalism and morality.

Economics, Ecology and Ethics, Spring 2022, Department of Agricultural and Applied Economics, Texas Tech University

An introduction to economics for non-economics majors focusing on ecology, social ethics, and inequality.

Teaching Assistant:

Causal Inference, Fall 2023, Department of Political Science, Texas Tech University

This course studies the problem of causal inference, the experimental ideal, and various quasi-experimental methods that attempt to produce causal estimates of policies and treatments from observational data.

Applied Macroeconomic Analysis, Fall 2023, Department of Agricultural and Applied Economics, Texas Tech University

This course focuses on the evolution of central banking, the analysis of financial crises, and other advanced topics related to macroeconomic development.

Global Business Economics, Spring 2023, Rawls College of Business

The course studies how business interacts with economic policy in a globalized world. Particular focus is given to the effects of international trade policy on business and citizen welfare, and the impacts of government and NGO policies on business, and overall economic development in poor countries.

Applied Business Economics, Spring 2021, Rawls College of Business, Texas Tech University

The course provides students with a better understanding of the relationship between the economic way of thinking and business decisions and strategy.

Economics of Regulation, Fall 2020, Rawls College of Business, Texas Tech University

This course studies the economic criteria of public regulation of private business with emphasis on the problems of public policy. Specific regulations studied include financial, commodities, energy, and housing markets.
